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You need to be proactive in finding a placement either by approaching a company in person or by using the letter template in your pack. This should be achievable by the deadline date but if you are having difficulties please see Mr Wilson.

You should now be actively seeking a placement for your work experience either by approaching a company in person or by using the letter template in your pack.

Once you have found your placement you will need to ensure your blue form is filled in and returned to school, this should be achievable by the deadline date of <u>Wednesday 20th December 2023</u>.



#### If you ask in person:

Make sure you look presentable, and that you are polite and interested

Ask to speak to the person in charge of organising work experience

Explain that you are at school in Year 10 and that you are interested in gaining some work experience in their company

Take your BLUE form – if they offer you a placement, ask them to fill this in whilst you wait

#### If you phone:

Ask to speak to the person in charge of organising work experience (leave a message if they are not there)

Explain that you are at school in Year 10 and that you are interested in gaining some work experience in their company

If the employer offers you some work experience, ask if there is a convenient time when you can pop in and get your BLUE form filled in

#### If you email:

Address your email to the work experience Manager

Explain that you are at school in Year 10 and that you are interested in gaining some work experience in their company

Tell them the dates of your work experience and that you would like to pop in and see them

Make sure you include your name and contact phone number

Make sure there are no spelling mistakes





#### MAKE IT A FAMILY THING

amily TV time is a great way to model the responsible enjoyment of echnology – showing your child how to use the smart TV safely for when they're old enough to watch it independently. You could also ake this opportunity to establish some healthy TV boundaries, uch as time limits on their daily viewing or how to make sure hey're only watching content that's appropriate for their age. ---

#### SET UP PARENTAL CONTROLS

It's likely that your smart TV has built-in parental controls, which not only let you filter out age-inappropriate shows, movies and games but can also restrict in-app purchasing, so your child can't accidentally spend money through the device. When you've enabled these safeguards, have an open conversation with your child about the reasons, helping them to understand the potential risks.

CREATE CHILD PROFILES

Much like with smartphones and tablets, apps can be downloaded onto smart TVs: from free content platforms such as BBC iPlayer to paid-for services like Prime Video. Most of these apps allow you to create a separate account for your child which has different setting to your own – suggesting more child-friendly material and reducing the possibility of them viewing explicit content.

#### CONSIDER THE LOCATION

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If you're concerned about the online safety hazards that a smart TV might pose to your child, you could consider where in your home you put the device. The safest option would be to place the smart TV in a shared family space – so that an adult is usually nearby and able to supervise while your child's watching it – rather than in the relative privacy of a bedroom.

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
