ATTENDANCE



- If a child is unavoidably absent from school parents are expected to:
- Contact the school by telephone call on the first day of absence and each subsequent day, identifying the reason for absence and the expected date of return (01328 701265 – Option 1 Extension 1)

If no contact is received, the Attendance protocols will be instigated.

If you are worried about your child/children attending school the first port of call is to discuss your concerns with the school directly. Our attendance officer may be able to help, and we work closely with the County Medical Needs Team and Inclusion Team who may also be able to help if needed.

GETTING TO SCHOOL

- **Alighting the bus:** Students are dropped off in the front car park and must come straight into school – please note down your bus number
- **Bus collection:** Outside school on Druids Lane (supervised by staff). Students must go directly from school to the bus through reception.
- **Bus Pass:** You need your bus pass. If lost, please see reception for a temporary pass.

SEAT BELTS MUST BE WORN

- **Car drop off:** Church Street, please use gate opposite the shop.
- **Car Collection:** Church Street gate, please arrange your collection point




NEED TO KNOW

- Post box is located opposite reception.





